Pablo and Rodrigo are two real survivors of Latin America's first high school massacre. Ten years later, they set out to find the classmate who shot them, an unforeseeable journey that unveils how two real people deal with their past through fiction.

Baghdad is a 17-year-old skater who lives in a working-class neighbourhood in São Paulo and hangs out with the boys in the skate park. When Baghdad meets a group of girl skateboarders, life suddenly changes.

Dir. Ángeles Cruz | Mexico, 2021 Mixtec & Spanish with English subtitles | 91 min A quietly powerful triptych of stories that speaks about the intimate realities of Indigenous women's lives as they converge during the patron saint's celebration in a Mixtec village in Oaxaca.
